HOW TO MAKE A MAJOR PENTATONIC BLUES SCALE



Test your skills by filling in the charts below. **Hint**: When counting half-steps, remember that you do *not* count the original key—i.e. when finding a minor 3rd from C, do not count C as the first half step. $m_3 m_2 m_3$

Major 2nd (M2) - 2 half steps
