Circle of 5ths Challenge

Printing Instructions:

Print on regular white paper or cardstock.
Laminate for multiple uses.

Sweet Treat Idea:

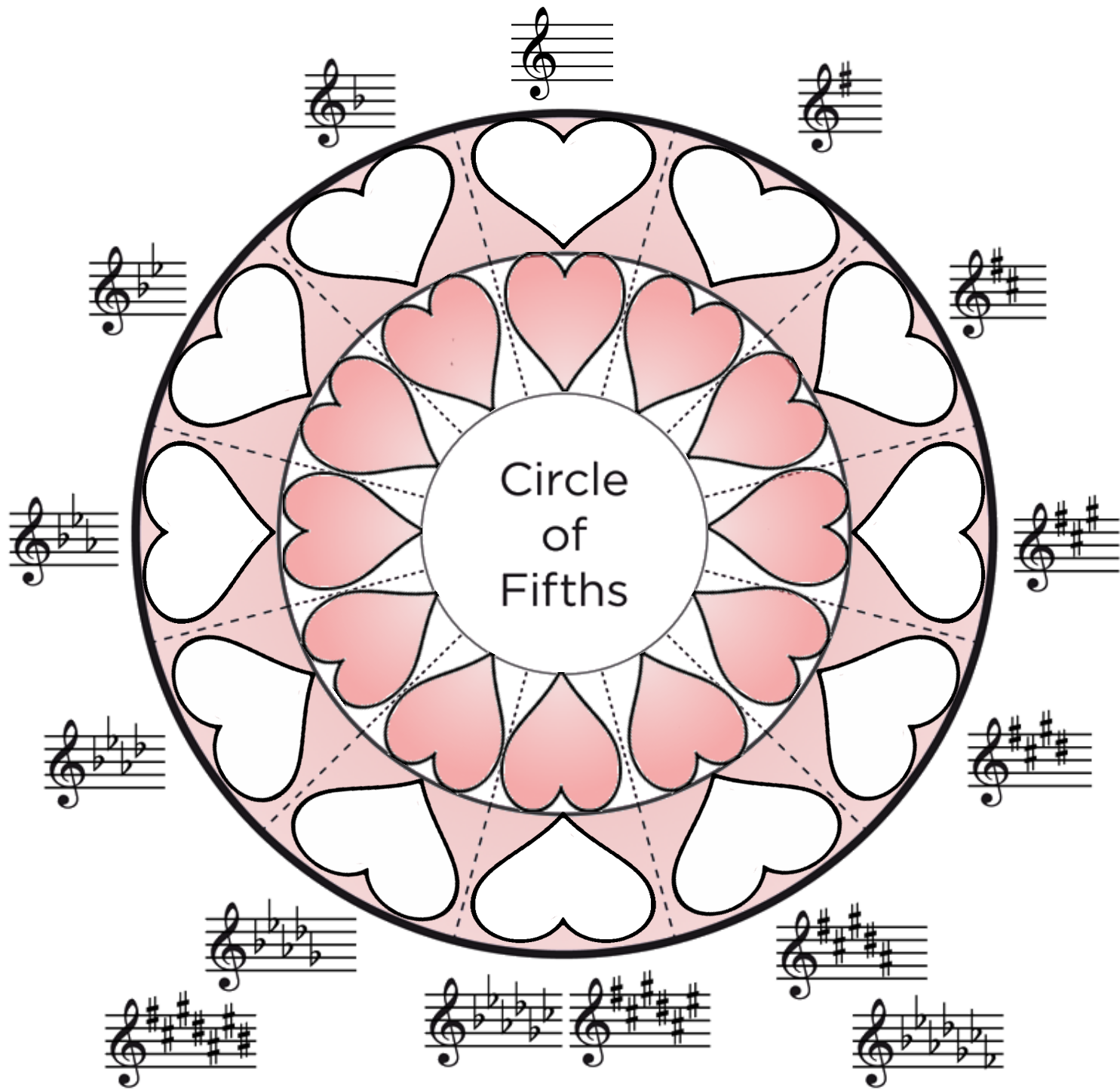
Use this chart to teach younger students about the Circle of 5ths. Place small candies on each of the major key hearts. Teach students to travel in fifths up and down the piano. Students can “remove” (eat!) each key as they practice.

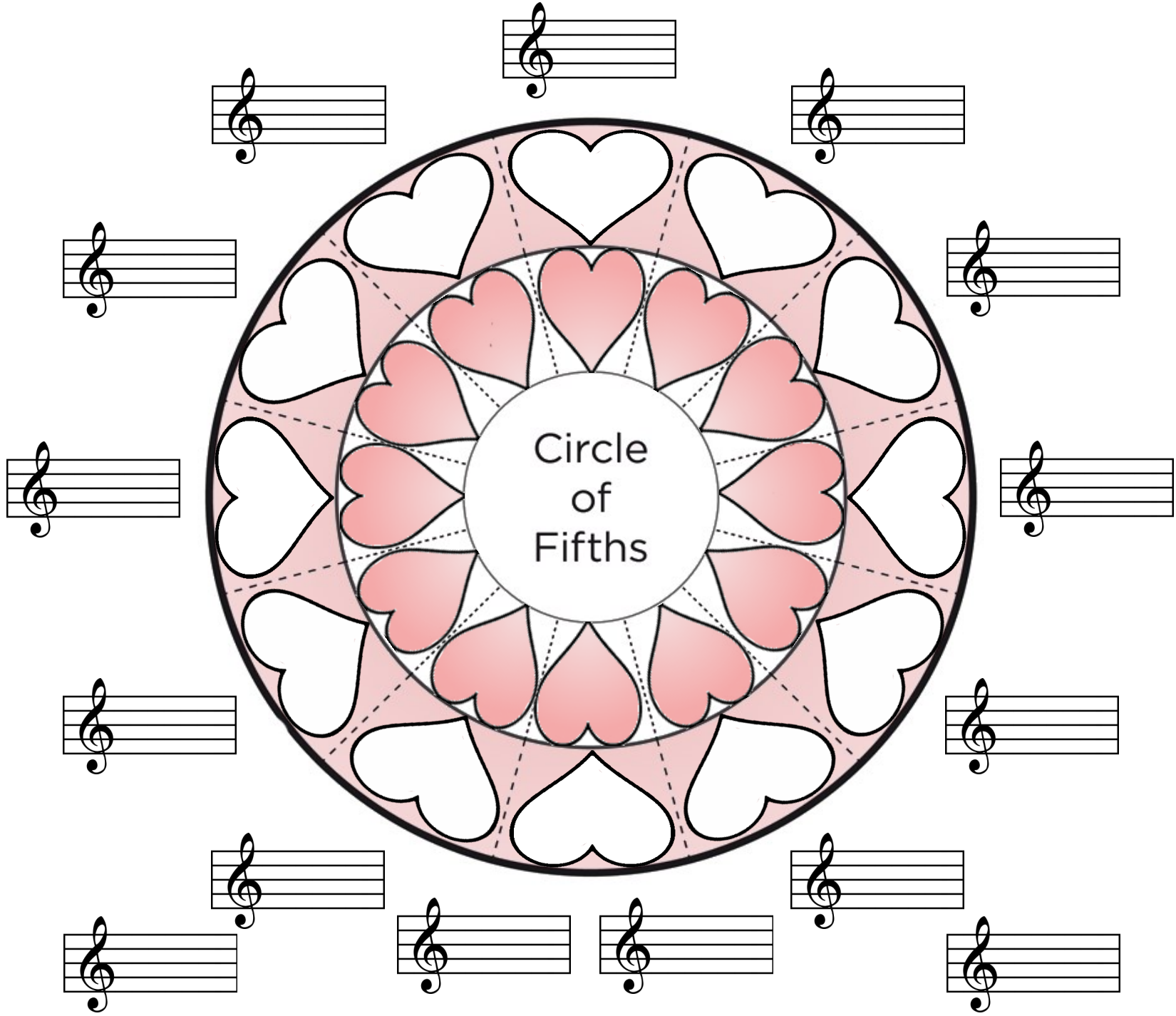
Game Options:

Regular Challenge: Have a student race against the clock to fill in all the major and minor keys. Students may use the piano for reference. Play twice to see if the student can beat their first time.

Treble Clef Challenge: Students must fill in the keys *and* the key signatures.

Bass Clef Challenge: We see Circle of 5ths with treble clef key signatures all the time — this time the student has to put them in bass clef!
